ABOUT

One of the most popular summer destinations in the Lower Mainland, Cultus Lake Provincial Park is located 11km southwest of Chilliwack. Cultus Lake Provincial Park includes four campgrounds. The park is a great place to fish, power boat, windsurf, stand-up paddleboard, hike and camp.

Cultus Lake Provincial Park is located near the vacation community of Cultus Lake. This community has many activities for the whole family including waterslides, boat and jet ski rentals, go-carting, mini golf and plenty of restaurants.

Cultus Lake's four group sites are perfect for family reunions, youth group camping or corporate retreats. Three of the four group sites are located right beside the lake and the fourth is located a one minute's walk to the lake. There are two group sites located on the west side of the lake, in a private area.

FACILITIES AND SERVICES



Firewood is available for purchase from a Park Attendant.



Washroom facilities can be found in each of the 4 campgrounds. Please refer to the map for their exact locations.



Maple Bay and Entrance Bay are home to the two main day use areas within the park. There are picnic tables (some with BBQ stands for hibachis), change houses and flush toilets. Spring Bay the third day use area has picnic tables and pit toilets only.



All 4 campgrounds in the park have shower facilities located in the main washrooms. Please refer to the map for their exact location.



Drinking water is available throughout the park.



A sani-station is available in the park. The sani-station is located across from the Maple Bay day use area.



There are double paved boat launching ramps located at Maple Bay and Jade Bay. Jade Bay boat launch is open year round. The Maple Bay boat launch is open during the peak season. There is parking available for boat trailers during the day only. Boats cannot be left in the water or beached overnight.



A playground is located at the Entrance Bay day use area.

The Gatehouse sells ice, firewood, BBQ propane and rents propane campfires.

A BBQ Propane Cylinder purchase and exchange program is available at the Gatehouse.

THINGS TO DO



Hiking There are five main trails for you to enjoy and admire the wonders of nature.

Teapot Hill Trail (5km, 2 hours return) Located just slightly east and across from the Honeymoon Bay group sites you will find a small parking area and the trailhead for Teapot Hill. There are some steep sections making this trail moderately difficult but a great workout with some nice views overlooking the lake.

Seven Sisters Trail (2 hours return) This trail connects Entrance Bay to the Clear Creek campground. Along the trail, stands a group of large Douglas-fir trees, once numbering seven.

Cultus Lake Horse Trail (20km, 5 hours one way) The Cultus Lake Horse Trail is accessible from the Watt Creek parking lot on south side of the Columbia Valley HWY across from the Maple Bay campground. This trail connects with many other trails up on the hillside including Teapot Lookout and travels all the way east to the park entrance (Edmeston Road). Please be advised that horses and bicycles must stay on designated trails.

Giant Douglas-fir Trail (45 minute return) Beginning 150 metres west of Delta Grove campground this walk leads to this forest goliath and also connects with Clear Creek campground.

Maple Bay Trail (30 minute return) Starting near the Maple Bay day use parking lot this trail provides a self-guiding interpretive stroll past some of the park's natural wonders.



Canoeing, Kayaking, and Standup PaddleboardingPaddle Sport rentals are offered by Sea to Sky Parks.
