

Chilliwack Lake Provincial Park

ALCOHOL Consumption of alcohol in a public place (motor vehicle, day use area, parking lot, etc.) is prohibited. The consumption of alcohol is only permitted within campsite boundaries for Park Users who are registered occupants of a campsite and over the age of 19. Where alcohol is on site, minors must be accompanied by a parent/guardian.

GENERATOR USE Generator use is only permitted from 9:00am to 11:00am and from 6:00pm to 8:00pm. Generators must be placed on campsite pad, not in surrounding vegetation. Generators are not permitted in walk-in campsites.

FIRE Collection and burning of deadwood, driftwood, leaves, branches and other debris is prohibited. Campfires are permitted in designated fire rings only. Flames may not extend higher than the fire ring grill. Park Users may bring their own firewood or purchase it onsite from a Park Attendant. Leaving your campfire unattended is a serious offence. Removal/moving of fire pits may result in eviction.

LITTER Deposit litter and recycling in receptacles provided for that purpose and strive for "Leave no Trace". Please keep your campsite clean and ensure all garbage is disposed of in a timely manner before leaving your site to avoid bear – people conflicts.

NOISE Out of respect for other campers all noise which disturbs others is prohibited between 10:00pm and 7:00am. Excessive noise causing a disturbance is not permitted at any time.

GATE The park gate is closed between 11:00pm and 7:00am.

VEHICLES & ATVs All vehicles that stay beyond 10:00pm must have their own registration permit. Maximum allowance of vehicles per site is 2, and the fee for a 2nd vehicle is half the regular campsite fee but a 2nd RV must pay a full campsite fee. All vehicles must park in designated lots or on gravel portion of campsites. No parking is permitted along roadways/sides. No overnight parking is permitted in day-use lots. ATVs and unlicensed motorbikes are prohibited in Provincial Parks.

LOSS OF PROPERTY Never leave your valuables unattended. Management is not responsible for lost or damaged property. All losses should be reported to RCMP and Park Operator as soon as possible.

CAMPsites To assist in preserving and encouraging new growth of vegetation, please ensure that all vehicles, tents and camping equipment remain on the gravel portion of your campsite. Barbeques must be used on the ground unless barbecue attachments are provided on the picnic tables.

FIREARMS Firearms, bows and cross-bows are only permitted for the use of hunting during the hunting season with the appropriate licence within the provincial park boundary. To discharge a firearm, bow or cross-bow you must be at least 400 meters away from BC Park roadways or campgrounds.

BEARS Lock all your food and cooking equipment inside your vehicle when not in use. NEVER feed or approach bears. For more information about safe practices with bears visit www.bearaware.bc.ca. To report bear sightings, poachers or polluters, please contact the 24 hour conservation hotline at 1-877-952-RAPP.

DOMESTIC ANIMALS All dogs must be on a leash at all times inside the provincial park boundaries. Please clean up after your pet. Pets are not allowed in the day-use/ beach areas or park buildings, unless in designated dog beach/ swimming area. Please be reminded that BC Parks does not recommend bringing pets into the backcountry or on trails, as they can create potential conflicts with wildlife.

FISHING Fishing is permitted within the provincial park with a valid fishing license. For more information, or to purchase a license visit, www.fishing.gov.bc.ca.

SWIMMING & BOATING Hard shelled crafts or any craft with a motor are not allowed in the swimming area to the left of the boat launch. There is no lifeguard on duty at any time. The dog beach is located to the right of the boat launch. All boaters should be aware of the afternoon cross-winds that occur on the lake, and the strong current at the mouth of the Chilliwack River. Do not fish or allow dogs or children near the river. The beach area and the gate to the boat launch are closed between dusk and 8:00am. There is no overnight parking and no camping on the lake shore.

CHECKING IN & OUT Check in time is 1:00pm and Check out time is 11:00am. Maximum stay is 14 days in any calendar year. To re-register, please do so at the Park Office in the Service Yard between 9:00 am and 11:00 am the day your permit expires (only applies to available sites within the 2-day rolling window). The site may not be available if there is a reservation that day for the site.

RESERVATIONS & CANCELLATIONS Reservations for campsites can be made up to four months in advance of your arrival date. Refunds are not given for an eviction, vacating your campsite early, or due to inclement weather.
